Thanks to our dedicated volunteers, Meals on Wheels reaches every corner of our community—Jerome, Clarkdale, Cottonwood, Camp Verde, Cornville, Beaver Creek, Lake Montezuma, and unincorporated areas of Yavapai County. Together, our volunteer drivers along with our kitchen and administrative helpers, prepare and deliver more than 40,000 meals each year. With 17 routes covering 1,745 miles each month, and over 327 volunteer hours donated monthly, they ensure seniors are nourished, connected, and never forgotten!

Monday through Friday, The Station on 6th also serves over 11,000 delicious, nutritious meals a year in our beautiful dining room. By utilizing our historic and multipurpose facility, we connect hundreds of individuals with wellness and health information, local and relevant resources, financial and planning advisors, music and entertainment opportunities, engaging activities and games, but most importantly, we connect our community members with other folks sharing similar interests.
